Art, Biodiversity & Conservation: Can art play a role in helping people connect with and protect nature?



Exploring Peatlands in Glenveagh

Hop on board the minibus leaving from the bus stop at 2.30pm. We'll be heading up the glen for a stroll through the valley looking back to the historical influences in the landscape, future restoration plans and the role of technology. Tea & Coffee in the old stalkers hut and conversations with Lee McDaid, Wild Atlantic Nature, Saskia Goeckeritz, Nottingham Trent University and Cathal Ryan.

Walk is 3.5km back to the castle, with options to use the park shuttle bus service, or enjoy a further 3.5km walk back to the car park. Last bus from castle is 5.15pm.
